Reformation: 504th Anniversary

On October 31, 1517, Dr. Martin Luther nailed 95 theses (statements he wished to defend in a public debate) to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Saxony, Germany. His theses challenged the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church, which had become misled by a dangerous emphasis on unscriptural traditions and man-made laws during the Dark Ages of medieval Europe.

As an Augustinian monk, a Roman Catholic priest, and a professor of theology, Dr. Martin Luther wanted to reform the many abuses he saw in the medieval church and return to the Holy Bible as the only source of true teaching. This desire for reform led to the formation of a new visible church (the Lutheran church). Thankfully, through this reformation, God has preserved the truth that our salvation was won for us completely by our Savior Jesus Christ. The exclamation, “Sola gratia! Sola fide! Sola Scriptura! Solus Christus! (By grace alone! By faith alone! By Scripture alone! In Christ Alone!)” became the rallying cry for the proclamation of the gospel.

Today we celebrate the 504th anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation. Soli Deo gloria! (To God alone be glory!)

A Dialogue of Repentance and Forgiveness

Selected sections of Martin Luther's 95 Theses with supporting Bible verses

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Congregation: Amen.

When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, “Repent,” he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance. (*Thesis 1*)

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. (*Psalms 51:1-2*)

Any truly repentant Christian has a right to full remission of penalty and guilt, even without indulgence letters. *(Thesis 36)*

There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace, through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. *(Romans 3:22b-25a)*

The true treasure of the church is the most holy gospel of the glory and grace of God. *(Thesis 62)*

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. *(Romans 5:1)*

Christians should be exhorted to be diligent in following Christ, their Head, through penalties, death, and hell, and thus be confident of entering into heaven through many tribulations rather than through the false security of peace. *(Theses 94 & 95)*

And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm, and steadfast. To him be the power forever and ever. Amen.
(1 Peter 5:10-11)

I gave you all Israel and Judah. And if all this had been too little, I would have given you even more. ⁹Why did you despise the word of the LORD by doing what is evil in his eyes? You struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and took his wife to be your own. You killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. ¹⁰Now, therefore, the sword will never depart from your house, because you despised me and took the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your own.'

¹³Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD."

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,

Here we pray that God our Father in heaven would look with mercy on all his children on earth. We ask him to give us grace that we might proclaim his Word faithfully and live our lives according to his will, for then we show that his name is precious to us. We also pray that he would keep us from any teaching and living which would dishonor his name.

Your kingdom come,

We pray that his kingdom and the rule of his grace might come to us and grow in us each day; that all who are still captives in Satan’s kingdom might be brought to know Jesus Christ, his Son, so that the Christian Church might grow and prosper.

Your will be done on earth as in heaven.

We pray that the Holy Spirit would strengthen us to do and accept God's will in life and death, in good times and in bad, and that we might have power to put down our own sinful will and its desires.

Give us today our daily bread.

We pray that our Father would also give us our daily bread, preserve us from greed and selfish desires, and help us to trust that he will provide for all our needs.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.

We ask that God would forgive our sins as we forgive those who sin against us so that our hearts may rest and rejoice in a good conscience before him, and that no sin may ever frighten or alarm us.

Lead us not into temptation.

We pray here that God would protect us from all temptations and help us by his Spirit to put down our sinful flesh, to despise the world and its vices, and to overcome the devil and all his trickery.

But deliver us from evil.

And finally we pray that God would deliver us from all evils of body and soul now and forever.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever.

Amen.

All those who sincerely desire these things will say from their hearts "Amen," trusting without doubt that their prayers are answered in heaven, as Christ has promised: "Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you will receive it, and it will be yours."
