Restrooms are located to the left and right of the water fountain in the lobby.

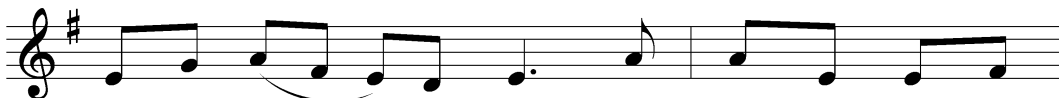

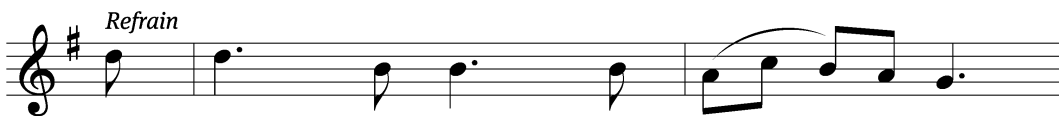

A Dialogue of Repentance and Forgiveness

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Message from God's Word

Luke 1:26-56

²⁶In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

²⁹Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. ³⁰But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. ³¹You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³²He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. 

The Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath's meaning is that of beauty in simplicity: Jesus, the Light of the world, has come and will come again. It's a countdown to Jesus in two ways: Each week we're one week closer to celebrating his first coming at his birth *and* to his second coming at the end of time. The wreath is a circle of evergreen boughs symbolizing eternal life. The blue of the Advent candles is the color of the sky, to which we look for Christ's return. The growing light leads to the white candle, lit on Christmas: Jesus, the Light of the World, has come and will come again.
